Check list for Readers

Preparation

Always read the readings carefully **several times** before the service, to make sure that you fully understand what is being said. It may help to look up the text before and after the section you will be reading. If you are not sure of pronunciation, check with the priest, or another reader.

Check whether anyone will be singing the Psalm and/or the Alleluia verse.

After the Opening Prayer both Readers go forward to in front of the altar and bow to the Sacrament in the tabernacle, the first Reader moves to the lectern and the second sits in the front pew.

Say where the reading comes from e.g. 'a reading from the first letter of St. Paul to the Philippians'. There is no need to say 'the first/second reading is...' nor to read the summary of the reading.

First Reading –If the Psalm is to be sung you can leave the lectern after your reading, and go to sit in the front pew.

Psalm - If reading the Psalm make a short pause after the first reading and read out the response twice, letting the congregation join in on the second reading. Read each verse and then read the response with the people.

Second Reading – approach the lectern after the Psalm.

Alleluia verse - After the Second Reading invite the congregation to stand - '**Please stand to greet the Gospel**' If this is to be sung then you can leave the lectern, otherwise read the verse. At the end leave the lectern. **The two Readers should bow to the Sacrament in the tabernacle together after the Psalm before returning to their seats.**

Intercessions/Bidding Prayers

If you are reading the 2nd Reading you are responsible for the Intercessions.

Approach the altar after the Creed.

There are three parts to the intercessions:

1. Invitation
2. Intentions
3. Concluding Prayer

The Invitation and Concluding Prayer are said by the priest.

You may write your own intercessions or use the pre-prepared ones, which are left in a tray by the side entrance. If writing your own keep them short and to the point - it may be useful to use the prepared ones as a guide. The priest will introduce them, using the introduction on the prepared sheet.

After each intention is read aloud by the reader, a significant pause should be left before the congregation is invited to respond. This pause allows people to consider the intention in silence. The length of the pause may vary, but **a minimum of 10 seconds is not unreasonable**. You will need to use your judgement, but we hope that the congregation will get used to longer pauses.

If not using the prepared prayers you should look over to the priest to signal that you have completed your intercessions. Wait till the priest has said the concluding prayer before bowing to Sacrament in the tabernacle and then returning to your seat in the congregation.

Three forms of response are commonly used:

- 1) Reader: Lord, hear us. People: Lord, graciously hear us
- 2) Reader: Lord, in your mercy People: Hear our prayer
- 3) Reader: We pray to the Lord People: Lord, hear our prayer

You should make the response clearly to guide the congregation for, at least, the first of the intercessions.
